



### **A Tribute to George Mulholland**

July 12, 1938 - October 23, 2024

Three words come to mind when we think of Lion George Mulholland: leadership, enthusiasm, and wisdom. "The real leader has no need to lead - he is content to point the way." This quote by Henry Miller exemplified Lion George's leadership style. He knew that the welfare of NM Lionism was so dependent on signature projects such as the Lions Crane Reading Program and KidSight and to this end he strived to help in any capacity he could. Lion George never aspired to rise to higher Lions positions in the District or Multiple District but rather he chose to stay "in the trenches and fight the good fight."



Ralph Waldo Emerson once stated that, "Enthusiasm

is one of the most powerful engines of success. When you do a thing, do it with all your might. Put your whole soul into it. Stamp it with your own personality. Be active, be energetic and faithful, and you will accomplish your object. Nothing great was ever achieved without enthusiasm." These words so reflect Lion George's philosophy of life and especially that of being a Lion. His unrelenting enthusiasm and sincere passion for Lionism, especially the Crane Reading Program, were contagious if you were ever around him. After talking with him, you were always fired up and ready to do more.

Lion George was a man of extraordinary wisdom. "A big man is one who makes us feel bigger when we are with him," a quote by John C. Maxwell, so well describes how he dealt with his fellow Lions. There was always a "job well done" compliment for anything you had recently done and a verbal expression of how important you were to NM Lionism. He truly appreciated everything NM Lions were doing to make their communities better, especially for the youth of NM.

Lion George was a very special person because he made a difference, a trait we should all strive for. His undying spirit will provide the impetus for us to do more as Lions for our fellow man to make this a better place for all. He was a dear friend whom we will sorely miss. Our sorrow will be eased by the many fond memories he left us and he will remain in our hearts and minds forever. Farewell fellow Lion and dear friend.

we listened to Christmas Carols while enjoying the treats. The gifts were opened, the children were pleased. Another great Christmas at the Ranches, indeed.







#### PEACE POSTER, YOUTH CAMPS AND EXCHANGE AND STRIDES cont'd.

#### PEACE POSTER BASIC RULES – Peace Without Limits

- The contest is open to students who will be 11, 12, or 13 years of age on November 15, 2024. Eligible bird dates are November 16, through November 15, 2013.
- Artwork must be no smaller than 13 inches by 20 inches and no larger than 20 inches by 24 inches. Do not mat or frame artwork.
- 3. Only one entry student and each entry must be the work of only one student.
- All artwork must be the individual student's original creation. Duplications are not accepted.
- All media are accepted. Note: Chalk, charcoal and pastel entries should be sealed with a fixative to prevent smearing. Do not laminate entries.
- Three-dimensional entries will not be accepted. Nothing may be glued, stapled or attached to the artwork in any way.
- The use of lettering or numbering on the front of the poster, in any language, is not allowed. All artist signatures or initials should be written on the back of the poster.
- Artwork should be done on a flexible material so it can be rolled for shipping in mailing tube. Do not fold poster
- LION DEADLINES: OCTOBER 1 Kit Purchase; November 15 Postmark deadline for a club to send one winning poster per contest sponsored to the District Governor; December 1 – Postmark deadline for DG to send one winning poster to the multiple district council chairperson; and December 15 – Postmark deadline for the MDCC to Brand & Creative at Lions International Headquarters.

## Peace Without Limits

Your club can sponsor visually-impaired students in the Lions International Essay Contest

The contest is open to students who are considered visually impaired according to their national guidelines, and will be 11, 12 or 13 years of age on November 15, 2024. Eligible birthdates are November 16, 2010 through November 15, 2013. One grand prize winner will receive an award and US\$5,000.

The contest theme is "Peace Without Limits."

- Only a Lions club can sponsor the contest. The contest may be sponsored in a local school or organized, sponsored youth group, or individuals may be sponsored as well.
- Essays must be no longer than 500 words, submitted in English, typewritten in black ink and double spaced.
- Each essay must be submitted with a completed entry form. Essays submitted without completed entry forms will be disqualified.
- · Only one entry per student per year, and each entry must be the work of only one student.
- · Essay entries cannot have already been published.
- Any essays found to be plagiarized will be disqualified, and the student will be prohibited from entering any future Lions competitions.

#### DEADLINES

November 15, 2024 – Postmark deadline for a club to send one winning essay to the district governor. Note: A participating club should notify its district governor in advance of sending an entry and confirm the date of the district judging at that time.

December 1, 2024 – Postmark deadline for a club not belonging to a district to send one winning entry directly to Brand & Creative at Lions Clubs International.

December 1, 2024 – Postmark deadline for a district to send one winning essay to the multiple district council chairperson. A district not belonging to a multiple district must send its entries directly to Brand & Creative at Lions Clubs International (postmarked by December 1).

December 15, 2024 – Postmark deadline for a multiple district to send one winning essay to Brand & Creative at Lions Clubs International.

February 1, 2025 - Club presidents of international winners will be notified on or before this date.
